Charles's family ran the gift shop at Antares Point on Route 66, just north of Kingman, AZ, where he spent countless hours listening to travelers' stories and witnessing the enduring allure of the "Mother Road." These experiences sparked a passion in Charles to capture and share the essence of Route 66 with the world.

Our journey to create this documentary began in 2019, driven by a desire to commemorate Route 66 as it approaches its centennial anniversary in 2026. We set out to document the rich history of the highway and spotlight the resilience and spirit of the communities and businesses that continue to thrive along its path. However, like many creative endeavors, our progress was unexpectedly halted by the Covid-19 pandemic in 2020.

The pandemic forced us to pause our production and rethink our approach, but it also reinforced the importance of our mission. During this time, we witnessed how crucial Route 66 remains as a lifeline for many towns, offering hope and continuity in challenging times. This pause allowed us to deepen our connection to the stories we aim to tell, refining our vision and preparing for a more impactful return to production.

It is a celebration of the highway's past, an examination of its present, and a hopeful glance into its future.
